Wisconsin Arts Board

The Wisconsin Arts Board was established by Chapter 90, Laws of 1973, as the state agency responsible for the support and development of the arts in Wisconsin.

More specifically, the State Legislature directed the Arts Board to continually study the artistic and cultural activities within the state; assist arts activities in the state; assist communities in creating and developing their own arts programs; encourage and assist freedom of artistic expression; and plan and implement a program of contracts with or grants-in-aid to groups or individuals of exceptional talent engaged in or concerned with the arts.

To meet these responsibilities, the Arts Board operates as both a service agency providing information and technical assistance and a funding agency providing matching grants and fellowships for arts activities and projects throughout Wisconsin.

As a funding agency, the Arts Board assists arts organizations and individual artists through a variety of programs designed to provide broad public access to the arts, strengthen the state's artistic resources, and create opportunities for individuals of exceptional talent. Financial support programs include Organizational and Individual Projects, Artistic Program Support, Salary Assistance, Community Projects, Fellowships, Artists-In-Residence, and Percent for Art. Through these programs the Board supports every artistic discipline and every segment of the arts community in the state including individual artists, community art groups, arts producing and exhibiting organizations, government units, schools and other institutions.

Through the newly created Percent for Art Program, the Arts Board helps to encourage the employment of visual artists and to increase the public's access to works of visual art. Through the Board's Research and Information Program the agency serves as a statewide resource for information about the arts and promotes Wisconsin's artistic resources through publications, workshops and research.

Members of the Board

Heading the Wisconsin Arts Board is a twelve-member citizen board responsible for agency policy and for final review and decisions on all applications for funding. Appointed to three-year terms by the Governor, members of the board serve on a voluntary, non-salaried basis. Members of the board during fiscal 1982 were:

Artists-in-Residence

The Artists-in-Residence Program provides for the professional development of artists and for broad public access to their works by supporting opportunities for artists to live and work in communities throughout Wisconsin. The program awards matching grants to schools and other non-profit organizations to have professional artists in residence for periods ranging from one week to a full year.

During fiscal 1982, the Arts Board awarded grants for 82 Artists-in-Residence projects in the areas of architecture and design, visual arts, filmmaking, creative writing, music, theatre, dance, storytelling, jazz, and folk arts. Exemplary programs included the state's first residency in music composition, a year-long project in the Oshkosh school system with composer John Harmon, as well as the completion of a three-year architecture residency in which students from Stevens Point schools worked alongside architects in developing working models for the redesign of downtown Stevens Point.

Other activities during 1981-82 included an expansion of conferences and technical assistance workshops for artists and educators, increases in the number and length of residency projects, and joint sponsorship with the Department of Public Instruction of a special seven-day summer residency for talented high school students. This residency included forty students from all areas of the state working with master artists in the areas of painting and sculpture, music improvisation and folk arts.

Community Arts Program

The purpose of the Community Arts Development Program is to encourage broad public involvement and local responsibility for the planning and support of arts programs which address community needs and goals through a variety of arts experiences and which preserve a place in contemporary life for the traditional arts.

The Community Arts Program is the Arts Board's most effective vehicle for providing all Wisconsin citizens, especially those in underserved geographic regions, with access to the arts. Through this program, the Arts Board awards matching grants to community arts organizations either for the support of local arts activities administered by the organization or for the development of the organization itself. Utilizing both state and federal revenues, the Community Arts program has been able to support a variety of activities throughout the state. Overall, twenty-six grants were awarded to nineteen community arts agencies and arts projects. Activities supported included festivals, workshops, classes, management training, concerts, outreach services, and visual arts exhibitions.

For 1983, the Community Arts Program will be developing a Folk Arts Program to support, preserve and present the traditional art forms of Wisconsin. Plans for the program include the development of folklore programs in schools, a folklorist conference in Wisconsin and the funding for pilot folk art projects.

The resources of the Community Arts Program will also focus on technical assistance to local arts agencies. During fiscal 1983, the Arts Board will provide workshops and consultants for local fund raising development, marketing, planning, programming and community arts needs assessment. To expand the availability of the live professional arts to communities throughout Wisconsin, the program will develop a network of performing arts presenters. The Board hopes to bring improved economics to the experience of touring the live performing arts in our state. The network, PAN-Wisconsin, will significantly improve the support system for the touring arts in Wisconsin.

Grants Program

The purpose of the Grants Program is to promote the artistic growth of Wisconsin artists and arts organizations and to provide opportunities for active audience participation especially for those in geographically isolated areas and with limited local arts resources.

During fiscal 1982, the Arts Board took major steps to improve its Grants Program by restructuring the categories of support, improving grant guidelines and award criteria, and creating the capacity to research grant requests in greater detail.

The Grants Program now offers:

Individual Projects - matching grants for costs associated with the completion of works in progress.

Organizational Projects - matching grants for costs associated with administrative or artistic projects

Salary Assistance - structured administrative support. These funds account for 15% of the Arts Board's grants budget and are very competitive.

Artistic Program Support - support for the artistic costs of major state institutions.

Fellowships - unrestricted cash awards for 6 outstanding Wisconsin visual and literary artists.

Chairman's Action Grant - small, emergency grants extended on the agreement of the Executive Director and the Board's Chairperson.

The Arts Board made 154 awards from the Grants Program totaling \$593,248. These grants provided assistance to art projects and activities in every county in the state.

Percent for Art Program

Recognizing that art is an integral part of our environment, the Wisconsin Legislature in 1980 created a program that provides money to be spent to purchase or commission original works of art for state constructed public buildings.

Under the law, 2/10 of one percent of the funding for new state building projects costing \$250,000 or more must be used to acquire works of art by living artists, preferably from Wisconsin. The benefits from the program include employment opportunities for Wisconsin artists, public access to works of art on a daily basis, and a reaffirmation of the quality of human creativity.

The impact of this legislation is unique and important. The state will build a collection of public art and artists will enjoy new opportunities to earn a living from their art. Unlike assistance provided to visual artists by other Arts Board programs, the Percent for Art Program works on the basis of a straight business arrangement for the purchase of a work of art. The Arts Board convenes an Advisory Committee to select works of art for direct purchase or to commission an artist to design an artwork for the project.

In the fiscal 1981-83 biennium, the State Building Commission approved forty-seven projects for inclusion in the program. These projects will generate up to \$495,300 in sales and commissions to Wisconsin artists. The projects include university buildings, state office buildings, a veteran's home, a military installation, state correctional institutions and a university fine arts center.

In addition to the projects listed on the next page, artist selection has begun on the following sites: Milwaukee District Department of Natural Resources Office, Milwaukee, WI; Waukesha State Office Building, Waukesha, WI; University of Wisconsin-Madison Physical Education Building, Madison, WI; University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point Kitchen Remodeling, Stevens Point, WI; and King Treatment Center Veteran's Home, King, WI.

Research and Information  
Services

Research and Information Services work in conjunction with the agency's funding programs to promote the arts and to assist Wisconsin's artists and arts organizations. There are three basic service functions--to provide Wisconsin residents with information about the Arts Board and its programs; to serve as a communication link between different segments of the arts community; and to promote the state's artistic resources. Part of the agency's responsibility as a public funding body is to ensure that as many people as possible have access to information about the Board's funding programs. To accomplish that, the Arts Board distributes announcements about grant deadlines and awards to both the press and constituents. In addition to single item releases, a newsletter was designed to provide factual arts information to interested members of the general public. Three issues of the Bulletin were distributed in fiscal 1982 based on a schedule of six issues per year. It includes information on out-of-state economic opportunities for artists, articles on Arts Board programs, and notice of federal and state grant deadlines.

With its ties to local, regional and national arts organizations, the Arts Board is a natural resource and dissemination point for information about the arts. A Percent for Art Opportunities Bulletin is distributed to artists, art galleries, museums and libraries throughout Wisconsin. Press releases are mailed to state newspapers and periodicals. A major 1982 accomplishment is the completion of a "profiled" mailing list. Using a questionnaire that allows respondents to self-identify key characteristics, the Arts Board now has a mailing list which can be broken down in a variety of ways. For example, if we receive notification of an out-of-state sculpture opportunity which has to be distributed quickly, the mailing list program can select sculptors only and can generate a list of labels in a day. The profiles also help the Arts Board identify the appropriate recipients for the distribution of specific program guidelines.

The Information Program actively works to promote Wisconsin's artists with a variety of publications and collaborative programs. In 1982, the Arts Board produced Wisconsin Arts and Crafts Fairs, a chronological listing of all fairs in the state with information useful to both art producers and consumers. In a collaborative promotional effort, the Arts Board works with Dane County and the City of Madison to place artwork by Wisconsin visual artists on the cover of the State-City-County Telephone Directory, a government publication distributed to over 22,000 state, city and county employees. That project was begun in 1980 and has continued successfully in 1981 and 1982. It also attracted the attention of the Wisconsin Telephone Company which purchased a work by a Wisconsin artist for placement on the 1982 telephone directory. The company plans to continue this practice for 1983 and 1984 as part of a three-year cycle.
